There are many types of opportunities in just about any area of interest you can imagine. Some types of experiences may be:

- Competitive Academic Programs/Institutes competitive programs typically require at least an application, essay, and transcript. Some may require writing samples, research, recommendations, etc. If selected these programs can help elevate the students resume.
- Volunteer/Community Service Mission trips, self-designed service projects, youth groups, etc.
 Volunteering your time in the summer is a great way to explore an area of interest, meet people and take on a leadership role. A self-designed service project with measured success can elevate the applicant resume.
- Travel there are many students focused travel organizations that offer a wide variety of experiences. Some trips have a community service aspect built into the itinerary.
- Work Experience a summer job can demonstrate responsibility, independence and maturity for the college applicant. Colleges typically like to see some work experience and they do not look down on your work at the tennis hut or snack bar at the local pool.
- Internships/Shadowing an opportunity to shadow or intern in a field of interest is a great opportunity.
